GOVERNOR MURPHY SIGNS LEGISLATION TO PERMIT ELECTRONIC PUBLICATION OF NOTICES

Governor Murphy signed Assembly Bill No. 5151/Senate Bill No. 3957 into law on December 31, 2024 (codified as P.L.2024, c.106) in an effort to address the growing issue of New Jersey print newspapers, including The Star-Ledger, moving to an electronic-only format. Under the new legislation, government agencies are permitted to continue posting required public notices and legal advertisements with newspapers that they utilized in 2024, even if those newspapers have switched to an electronic-only format. The legislation specifically identifies "the solicitation of bids, qualifications, or proposals, or the publication of any ordinances, synopses, or summaries as official documents" as the types of permissible postings. The electronic newspapers must make the information available free of charge to all readers and cannot require individuals to register with them before gaining access. Finally, the publishing fee cannot exceed the existing statutory rates.

While the law takes effect immediately, it is important to note that it is only a temporary measure effective through March 1, 2025. The Legislature will presumably work on a more permanent solution to address this issue between now and then.
